Excellency,

Further to the letter of 11 August regarding participation in the round tables of the High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development, on 14 and 15 September 2006, I have the pleasure to circulate revised lists of participants for the four round tables, as attached.

Let me say at the outset, that I am very encouraged by the strong interest expressed by Member States to participate in the High-level Dialogue plenary meetings and the round tables, and that so many Member States will be represented at a ministerial level.

Since the first tentative lists of participants for the four round tables were circulated, a number of additional requests have been forwarded to my office. In preparing the revised lists, Member States have, as far as possible, been assigned a round table of their preference. Due consideration has also been given to ensure equitable geographical distribution in all round tables.

All Member States who have expressed an interest to participate have been allotted one seat in one of the round tables. Several Member States have indicated their interest in participating in more than one round table, space permitting. However, very few vacant seats remain in round tables 1, 3 and 4. As announced in the letter of 11 August, vacant seats will be distributed no later than 1 September. In so doing, preference will be given to delegations represented at a ministerial level.


