In our capacity as co-facilitators for the preparations of the comprehensive review and assessment of the progress achieved in the prevention and control of Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs), we thank delegations for their active participation in the consultations thus far. The inputs given and positions expressed have been constructive and there appears to be sufficient consensus on those areas that require a decision from Member States.

Based on the wide range of bilateral consultations with various stakeholders and the inputs made during the informal-informal consultations on 29 January 2014, we have the honour to transmit herewith a zero-draft of a modalities resolution for consideration by Member States. We believe that the zero-draft reflects, in a balanced way, the emerging consensus on the way forward with the review process.

The co-facilitators will convene a second meeting to receive feedback on the zero-draft on Wednesday, 18 March 2014 at 3:00 p.m. in Conference Room 6 (NLB).

Proposed General Assembly Decision on the scope and the modalities of the comprehensive review and assessment of the progress achieved in the prevention and control of non-communicable diseases

The General Assembly,

Recalling the Political Declaration of the High-Level Meeting of the General Assembly on the Prevention and Control of Non-Communicable Diseases¹, and in particular paragraph 65 by which it decided to hold a comprehensive review and assessment of the progress achieved in the prevention and control of non-communicable diseases in 2014,

Recognizing the continued negative impact of non-communicable diseases, including the developmental and other challenges faced by all countries, in particular low and middle income countries,

Mindful of the need to maintain strong political commitment towards the prevention and control of non-communicable diseases,

Taking note of the Note by the Secretary-General transmitting the report of the Director-General of the World Health Organization on the prevention and control of non-communicable diseases²,

- 1. Decides to convene a high-level meeting to undertake the comprehensive review and assessment on 10 and 11 July 2014, consisting of an opening plenary meeting on 10 July 2014 from 9 a.m. to 10 a.m., and two consecutive round tables from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m., and two consecutive round tables on 11 July 2014 from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 3 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. followed by a closing plenary meeting from 5:30 p.m. to 6 p.m.
- Decides that the comprehensive review and assessment shall take stock of the
 progress made in implementing the commitments in the Political Declaration,
 identify gaps and reaffirm the political commitment to respond to the challenge of
 non-communicable diseases.
- 3. Decides that the speakers at the opening plenary will be the President of the General Assembly, the Secretary-General, the Director-General of the World Health Organization and a representative of civil society who will be chosen from among non-governmental organizations with consultative status with the Economic and Social Council and in consultation with Member States.
- 4. Decides further that the organizational arrangements of the round tables will be as follows:

(a) The round tables will address the overall theme of "Taking stock of progress in implementing the Political Declaration on the Prevention and Control of Non-Communicable Diseases and scaling up of multistakeholder and national multi-sectoral responses to the prevention and control of non-communicable diseases":

- (b) Each round table will be chaired at the Ministerial level or other high official level, to be appointed by the President of the General Assembly;
- (c) Participation in each round table will include Member States, observers, representatives of entities of the United Nations system and civil society and non-governmental organizations:
- (d) The President of the General Assembly shall draw up a list of nongovernmental organizations in consultative status with the Economic and Social Council who may participate in the high-level meeting;
- (e) The President of the General Assembly shall also draw up a list of representatives of other relevant non-governmental organizations, civil society organizations, academic institutions, and the private sector who may participate in the high-level meeting, taking into account the principle of transparency and the principle of equitable geographic representation, and submit the proposed list to Member States for their consideration and bring the list to the attention of the Assembly.
- Decides that the closing plenary will comprise the presentation of summaries of the round tables and the adoption of a concise, focused, action-oriented outcome document.
- 6. Requests the President of the General Assembly to organize, no later than June 2014, and in consultation with representatives of non-governmental organizations in consultative status with the Economic and Social Council, civil society organizations, the private sector and academia, an informal interactive hearing with non-governmental organizations, civil society organizations, the private sector and academia to provide an input to the comprehensive review and assessment.
