Background Information:

The briefing will look at the outcomes and recommendations of the general debate of the 61st Session of the General Assembly, including the High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development and the High-level Meeting on the Least Developed Countries. Under the theme of "Implementing a Global Partnership for Development", the general debate generated ideas and suggestions to create funding for development, also from the private sector. Other issues on the agenda included the situation in the Middle East, Sudan, and Iran; the Peacebuilding Commission, and the Human Rights Council.

During the <u>panel discussion</u> from 10:30 a.m. – 11:30 p.m., **Anwarul K. Chowdhury**, High Representative for the Least Developed Countries, Landlocked Developing Countries and Small Island Developing States; **Christopher Coleman**, Chief, Policy Planning and Mediation Support Unit, Department of Political Affairs; **Gail Bindley-Taylor Sainte**, Spokeswoman for the President of the General Assembly; and **Gregory Maniatis**, Special

Adviser to the Special Representative on Migration, Peter Sutherland, will offer their insights into what happened during the general debate as well as the two high-level meetings.

Representatives of NGOs will be able to ask questions during a Q and A session.
