#### **FOREWORD**

This is the sixth issue of the Law of the Sea Information Circular (LOSIC), a periodic publication of the Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea (DOALOS), Office of Legal Affairs. Its objective is to communicate to all States and entities, especially those that are not as yet parties to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS), information on any action taken by States Parties in implementing UNCLOS as well as on activities undertaken by DOALOS pursuant thereto.

The purpose of LOSIC is also to assist States Parties to UNCLOS to discharge their obligations by giving due publicity to information in accordance with the Convention. This is of particular importance to coastal States, which under UNCLOS are obliged, inter alia, to give due publicity with regard to (i) charts and lists of geographical coordinates (articles 16(2), 47(9), 75(2), 76(9) and 84(2)); (ii) laws and regulations relating to innocent passage (article 21(3)); (iii) laws and regulations of States bordering straits relating to transit passage (article 42(3)); and (iv) charts indicating sea lanes and traffic separation schemes (articles 22(4), 41(2), 41(6), 53(7) and 53(10)).

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#### Note:

Please note that Benin ratified the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea on 16 October 1997. The table showing the status of the Convention and of the Agreement relating to the implementation of Part XI of the Convention now reads as follows:

#### NOTES

In accordance with article 6, paragraph 1, the Agreement entered into force on 28 July 1996. On the same date, in accordance with its article 7, paragraph 3, the provisional application of the Agreement terminated In accordance with the provisions of section 1, paragraph 12 (a), of the Annex to the Agreement, States and entities referred to in article 3 of the Agreement which had been applying it provisionally and for which it was not in force were able to continue to be members of the Authority on a provisional basis, pending its entry into force for such States and entities, by sending a written notification to the depositary to that effect. The following States and entity made such notification: Bangladesh, Belgium, Cambodia, Canada, Chile, Congo, European Community, Gabon, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Luxembourg, Malaysia, Nepal, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Poland, Russian Federation, South Africa, Suriname, Switzerland, Ukraine, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America.

Paragraph 12(a) also provides that such membership shall terminate either on 16 November 1996 or upon the entry into force of the Agreement and the Convention for such member, whichever is earlier. Furthermore, it has empowered the Council to extend, upon the request of the State or entity concerned, such membership beyond 16 November 1996 for a further period or periods not exceeding a total of two years provided that the Council is satisfied that the State or entity concerned has been making efforts in good faith to become a party to the Agreement and the Convention.

At the resumed second session of the International Seabed Authority, held at Kingston (Jamaica) from 5 to 16 August 1996, the Council of the Authority approved requests for the extension of membership on a provisional basis of the following States: Bangladesh, Canada, Nepal, Poland and United States of America (document ISBA/C/9). With regard to the extension of provisional membership beyond 16 November 1996 for the other States and one entity which, in accordance with article 7, paragraph 1, of the Agreement, had applied the Agreement provisionally before its entry into force and which had subsequently notified the depositary of their intention to continue the provisional membership, the Council decided that those States or entities which submitted requests for an extension of membership beyond 16 November 1996 prior to the next session of the Council should be deemed to be members of the Authority on a provisional basis until the end of the next session of the Council, at which the Council would deliberate on such requests. The following States and entity have submitted requests for an extension: Belgium, Chile, European Community, Gabon, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Mozambique, Oatar, Russian Federation, Solomon Islands, South Africa, Switzerland, Ukraine, United Arab Emirates and United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. At the third session of the International Seabed Authority, held at Kingston from 17 to 27 March 1997, the Council of the Authority approved those requests (document ISBA/3/C/3). From April to September 1997, the following States became States Parties and, consequently, full members of the Authority: Chile, Mozambique, Russian Federation, Solomon Islands and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.



## II. INFORMATION ON ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN BY THE DIVISION FOR OCEAN AFFAIRS AND THE LAW OF THE SEA

#### A. Obligations of due publicity and deposit

- 1. <u>Communications addressed to the States Parties for the purpose of assisting them to comply with their due publicity/deposit obligations under the Convention</u>
- As mentioned in previous editions of LOSIC, the Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea, Office of Legal Affairs, as the substantive unit of the Secretariat, has informed the States Parties concerned that it is willing to assist them to comply with their due publicity/deposit obligations under the Convention.
- 2. Accordingly, upon a State becoming a State Party to the Convention, the Division informs the State concerned of the due publicity/deposit obligations pursuant to the Convention with which it must comply.
- 3. During the period between April and September 1997, the Division transmitted the following notes verbales to the States Parties indicated, recalling their due publicity/deposit obligations and offering its assistance with a view to compliance:
  - (a) Notes verbales MZ/SP/30 to MZ/SP/36, addressed to Pakistan, Russian Federation,
    Mozambique, Solomon Islands, Equatorial Guinea, United Kingdom of Great Britain and
    Northern Ireland and Chile, respectively, requesting the submission of charts or lists of
    geographical coordinates of baselines and various maritime limits pursuant to articles 16(2), 47(9),
    75(2), 84(2) and 76(9);
  - (b) Notes verbales TS/IP/SP/30 to TS/IP/SP/36, addressed to Pakistan, Russian Federation,
    Mozambique, Solomon Islands, Equatorial Guinea, United Kingdom of Great Britain and
    Northern Ireland and Chile, respectively, requesting the submission of laws and regulations
    relating to innocent passage through the territorial sea pursuant to article 21(3);
  - (c) Notes verbales SLTSS/SP/18 and SLTSS/SP/19, addressed to the Russian Federation and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, respectively, requesting the submission of charts indicating the designation, prescription or substitution of sea lanes and traffic separation schemes in the territorial sea and straits pursuant to articles 22(4) and 41(6);
  - (d) Note verbale SIN/TP/SP/11, SIN/TP/SP/12, and SIN/TP/SP/13 addressed to the Russian Federation, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and Chile, respectively, requesting the submission of laws and regulations relating to transit passage through straits used for international navigation pursuant to article 42(3).
- 4. Samples of the above-mentioned notes verbales may be found, <u>mutatis mutandis</u>, in LOSIC Nos. 2 and 3.

#### 2. Maritime Zone Notifications

5. The Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea, Office of Legal Affairs, has also circulated between April and September 1997 a number of maritime zone notifications for the purpose of informing other States Parties that a State Party has complied with one of its various due publicity and deposit obligations under the Convention.

- 6 The maritime zone notifications circulated are as follows:
  - (a) Maritime Zone Notification (M.Z.N. 14, 1997, LOS of 6 June 1997) regarding the deposit by **Japan** of charts showing the straight baselines for measuring the breadth of the territorial sea, and the outer limits of the territorial sea;
  - (b) Maritime Zone Notification (M.Z.N. 15, 1997, LOS of 7 August 1997) regarding the deposit by Romania of the list of geographical coordinates of points for the drawing of straight baselines and a chart showing its straight baselines and the outer limit of its territorial sea;
  - (c) Maritime Zone Notification (M.Z.N. 16, 1997, LOS of 30 September 1997) regarding the deposit by **Finland** of charts showing the straight baselines and the outer limits of the territorial sea of Finland, and the median line separating the continental shelf and fishery zones of Finland from the continental shelves and exclusive economic zones of Estonia and Sweden;
- 7. Duplicates of the above-mentioned maritime zone notifications are reproduced in Annex II to this publication.
- In this connection, it should be noted that the lists of geographical coordinates submitted in compliance with the due publicity and deposit obligations under the Convention are not published in the <u>Law of the Sea Information Circular</u> as that would be unwieldy and costly owing to their length. However, such lists of geographical coordinates as well as any charts may be consulted at the Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea, Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat. On the other hand, in instances where the lists of geographical coordinates submitted are not too lengthy, they are published in the <u>Law of the Sea Bulletin</u> (LOSB).

#### III. INFORMATION ON ACTION TAKEN BY STATES PARTIES TO IMPLEMENT THE CONVENTION

- A. Submissions by States Parties in compliance with their due publicity/deposit obligations
- During the months of April 1997 to September 1997, a number of States Parties submitted information in compliance with the due publicity and deposit obligations under the Convention. The information thus submitted has been circulated to the other States Parties by way of the marítime zone notifications, which are mentioned at paragraph 6 above.
- The States Parties having complied with their due publicity and deposit obligations during the period concerned are Finland, Japan and Romania.

#### IV INFORMATION ON OTHER ACTIONS TAKEN BY STATES

A. Note verbale of 14 May 1997 by the Permanent Mission of Argentina to the United Nations regarding note verbale No. 107/96 of 6 September 1996 by the Permanent Mission of Chile to the United Nations

The Permanent Mission of the Argentine Republic to the United Nations ... has the honour to refer to note verbale No. 107/96 of 6 September 1996 addressed to the Division from the Permanent Mission of Chile to the United Nations, which was published in <u>Law of the Sea Information Circular</u> No. 5.

The above-mentioned note contains observations on the declaration made by the Argentine Republic in depositing its instrument of ratification of the 1982 United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea and on the note verbale of 15 April 1996 from the Permanent Mission of the Argentine Republic addressed to the United Nations Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea, Office of the Legal Counsel, in reply to the Secretary-

General's note concerning the obligation originating in article 42 of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea.

In that context, it should be pointed out that, in ratifying that international convention, which, as the Government of Chile is well aware, was done subsequent to the entry into force of the Treaty of Peace and Friendship of 1984, the Argentine Republic irrefutably expressed its desire to maintain the full validity of all the provisions of the Treaty of Peace and Friendship of 1984; thus, the application of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea does not affect the legal regime of the above-mentioned bilateral treaty between Argentina and Chile.

Accordingly, the fact that the reference to the Strait of Magellan is followed by a reference to the existence of the navigation regime of the 1984 Treaty implies an express reaffirmation of article V of the 1881 Boundary Treaty and, in addition, of the full validity of the norms contained in annex 2 of the 1984 Treaty, including the legal status of the waters used for navigation.

These treaties contain regulations which affect third States. The Argentine presentation was for information purposes and did not put forward any interpretation of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea, the 1881 Boundary Treaty, the 1984 Treaty of Peace and Friendship or any other aspects of the issue.

As a party to the 1881 Boundary Treaty, the Argentine Republic has the power to refer to it in any documents it deems relevant. In this case, such power is even more obvious since this international instrument embodies a longstanding regime as recognized by article 35 (c) of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea. Therefore, it cannot be considered as being outside the legal framework of the Convention.

Moreover, article V of the 1881 Boundary Treaty, whereby the Strait of Magellan is neutralized forever with free navigation assured for the flags of all nations, creates obligations and rights both for the Argentine Republic and for the Republic of Chile. Therefore, both parties should ensure effective compliance with its provisions.

In addition, article 10 of the 1984 Treaty of Peace and Friendship - which, as noted above, replicates article V of the 1881 treaty - stipulates the obligation of the Argentine Republic to maintain, at any time and in whatever circumstances, the right of ships of all flags to navigate expeditiously and without obstacles through its jurisdictional waters to and from the Strait of Magellan.

Consequently, Argentina, as a State party, together with Chile, of the 1881 Boundary Treaty and the only one of the two which has become party to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea, has the power to give due publicity, in ratifying that Convention, to the legal regime for the area of the Strait of Magellan.

In view of the foregoing, there can be no doubt about the juridical grounds supporting the [Argentine] interpretative declaration and its note verbale of 15 April 1996. As mentioned above, a different scope and intention are being attributed to the instruments issued by the Argentine Republic than what is clearly evident in their texts and legal context.

The Argentine Republic cannot agree with other statements made by the Government of Chile in the above-mentioned notes. Among other things, it does not agree that the waters in the south of the Strait of Magellan have always been Chilean internal waters and not international straits. The Argentine Republic did not consider them as such until the 1984 Treaty of Peace and Friendship, which, as noted above, established a regime for navigation through the waters described in its annex 2.

In relation to the foregoing, it must be stressed that the norms codified in paragraph 2, article 8; paragraph 1, article 34; and subparagraph (a), article 35, of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea are also relevant aspects.

Moreover, the Argentine Republic does not share the interpretation concerning the inapplicability of Part III of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea, since such interpretation does not follow from article 35 (c) of the Convention. That norm, in fact, establishes that the provisions of Part III do not affect the legal regime in straits in which passage is regulated in whole or in part by long-standing international conventions in force.

Without prejudice to the above, it is not the purpose of the Argentine Republic to embark on a discussion of abstract topics or situations.

Since the issues raised in the present note must have an unequivocal interpretation both for the parties and for third countries, the Permanent Mission of the Argentine Republic to the United Nations requests the Secretary-General, through the United Nations Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea, Office of the Legal Counsel, to give due publicity to this document by including it in the next issue of the Law of the Sea Information Circular.

#### ANNEX I

### RECAPITULATIVE INFORMATION ON ACTION TAKEN BY STATES PARTIES TO IMPLEMENT THE CONVENTION

- 1. Under articles 16(2), 47(9), 75(2) and 84(2) of the Convention, due publicity is to be given by the coastal State Party to the Convention to charts or lists of geographical coordinates for baselines and outer limits of its various zones, and a copy of each such chart or list is to be deposited with the Secretary-General. Similarly, under article 76(9), the coastal State is to deposit with the Secretary-General charts and relevant information, including geodetic data, permanently describing the outer limits of its continental shelf, to which the Secretary-General shall give due publicity.
- 2. In order to carry out the functions entrusted to the Secretary-General under the Convention and to respond to the request made by the General Assembly in resolution 49/28, paragraph 15, and resolution 50/23, paragraph 9, the Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea of the Office of Legal Affairs, as the responsible substantive unit of the Secretariat, has established facilities for the custody of charts and lists of geographical coordinates deposited. The Division has also adopted a system for their recording and publicity: an internal computerized "data record" summarizes the information contained in the charts submitted, and to ensure publicity, the Division informs States Parties of the deposit of charts and geographical coordinates through a "Maritime Zone Notification".
- 3. The Division has sought to assist States with other obligations of due publicity established by the Convention, which relate to charts concerning designation of sea lanes and prescription of traffic separation schemes in the territorial sea or in straits, as well as laws and regulations adopted by the coastal State relating to innocent passage through the territorial sea or laws and regulations adopted by States bordering straits relating to transit passage through straits used for international navigation.

the legal, scientific or technical aspects of such field is established and generally recognized and who enjoy the highest reputation for fairness and integrity. The names of the persons so nominated in each field shall

constitute the appropriate list.
