Excellencies,

I wish to recall that, on 16 October 2020, a virtual informal session was convened to brief delegations on the pending items on the agenda of the thirtieth Meeting of States Parties to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea and the proposed organization of work, timetable and modalities for the consideration of these agenda items. I wish to thank all participating delegations for their expressions of support and constructive remarks.

Following the briefing, additional consultations with the Secretariat were required to factor in the availability of conference and interpretation services as well as other relevant activities taking place at the United Nations Headquarters in the coming weeks. I am pleased to provide, in the annex to this letter, the proposed timetable and modalities for the consideration of the pending items on the agenda, updated to reflect these further consultations.

The approached described during the briefing, however, has remained unchanged and relies on a combination of meetings conducted through virtual platforms with an in-person plenary meeting, as well as exchanges of documents and/or written statements. This hybrid approach reflects the aim of the Bureau to strike a balance between ensuring that time-sensitive agenda items are dealt with as soon as possible while also using the time efficiently, given the current phase of operations at the United Nations Headquarters in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic, the limited availability of conference rooms and the availability of virtual platforms and interpretation services.

I would welcome your written comments, if any, on the proposed timetable and modalities. Please convey your comments by 2 p.m. on Friday, 30 October 2020. I propose to proceed as outlined, on the understanding that no decisions would be adopted formally prior to the in-person plenary meeting, to be held at a date that is yet to be determined. The plenary meeting would formalize all of the work to be conducted in the proposed hybrid format and conclude the consideration of all the remaining agenda items of the thirtieth Meeting of States Parties.
