Twenty-eighth Meeting

<u>Information for participants</u>

The twenty-eighth Meeting of States Parties to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea will be held in New York from 11 to 14 June 2018 (see <u>General Assembly resolution 72/73 of December 2017</u>, paragraph 56).

Officers of the Meeting

In accordance with Rule 19 (Election of officers) of the Rules of Procedure for Meetings of States Parties (<u>SPLOS/2/Rev.4</u>), "[t]he Meeting of States Parties shall elect from among the representatives of States Parties participating in the Meeting the following officers: a President and four Vice-Presidents, one from each region, excluding the region of the President...".

Secretariat

The Office of Legal Affairs, through its Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea, carries out the secretariat functions for the Meeting of States Parties (Room DC2-0450, United Nations, New York, NY 10017, contact: doalos@un.org).

Provisional agenda and other documents

The provisional agenda for the twenty-eighth Meeting is contained in document <u>SPLOS/L.79</u>. The provisional agenda and all other documents of the twenty-eighth Meeting are available through the Official Document System of the United Nations (http://documents.un.org) or on the website of the Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea (http://www.un.org/Depts/los).

Credentials

Credentials of representatives of States Parties should be transmitted to the Secretariat (Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea) as soon as possible and no later than twenty-four hours after the opening of the Meeting on **Monday, 11 June 2018**, signed by the Head of State or Government or the Minister for Foreign Affairs or any person authorized by either of them (rule 13 (2) of the Rules of Procedure for Meetings of States Parties).

In conformity with the understanding reached by the twenty-third Meeting of States Parties (see <u>SPLOS/263</u>, paragraph 101), credentials should cover the period from 11 to 14 June 2018 and, to the extent practicable, also thereafter until the convening of the twenty-ninth Meeting of States Parties.

Observers

Observers are invited to transmit to the Secretariat (Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea) the names of the representatives who will form part of their delegation, as soon as possible, by letter or note verbale.

List of Speakers

According to its practice:

- (1) The Meeting does not have a list of speakers. Delegations wishing to speak under an agenda item may do so by requesting the floor when the deliberation on that item is opened.
- (2) The Meeting does not have a segment devoted to general statements. Delegations wishing to make statements of a general nature are encouraged to do so under the agenda item entitled "Report of the Secretary-General under article 319 for the information of States Parties on issues of a general nature, relevant to States Parties, which have arisen with respect to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea" (agenda item 13).

Papersmart

PaperSmart arrangements will be available for the duration of the twenty-eighth Meeting of States Parties. Delegations wishing to circulate

their statements electronically through the PaperSmart portal should send a copy of the statement at least one hour in advance of delivery to papersmart5@un.org. PDF format is preferred. The entity name, date of the meeting and the agenda item should be indicated in the heading of the statement and in the subject line of the email. Delegations are kindly requested to provide twenty hard copies of the text for the technical services no later than one hour before delivery of the statement.

Side events

Expressions of interest to hold side events during the Meeting should be communicated in writing to the Secretariat, no later than **31 May 2018**, with an indication of the title, organizing institution(s) and preferred date for the event to the following email address: doalos@un.org. The subject of the message should specify: "Side event: Meeting of States Parties."

UN Grounds Passes for Intergovernmental Organizations

Representatives from intergovernmental organizations with a standing invitation to attend the Meeting of States Parties should communicate their intention to attend the Meeting directly to the Protocol and Liaison Service (Room S-0201, Fax: +1 212 963-1921 or email: unprotocol@un.org) by **31 May 2018**, with a copy to the Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea. A template letter for this purpose is provided below at page 4. The representatives of intergovernmental organizations having a Liaison Office in New York should endeavour to obtain their United Nations grounds passes through that Office.

Intergovernmental organizations without an office in New York must submit a form SG.6 for each member of the delegation for issuance of grounds passes for temporary meetings, together with an official nomination letter (stamped and singed by the head of the organization) to the Protocol and Liaison Service, by **31 May 2018**. The official letter must also include a name and email address of a focal point to receive the accreditation approval. passes directly from the United Nations Pass Office at 320 East 45th Street. An official document with photograph (e.g., passport) identifying the representative must be presented at that time. Representatives without grounds passes will not be able to access the United Nations Headquarters compound.
