


1. This map is for illustrative purposes only.
 2. The Qatar - Iran maritime boundary is the Agreement concerning the boundary line dividing the continental shelf between Iran and Qatar, dated 20 September 1969.
 3. The maritime boundary between Qatar and Bahrain is that decided by the International Court of Justice in the Maritime Delimitation and Territorial Questions Between Qatar and Bahrain (Qatar v Bahrain) judgement in 2001.
 4. The Maritime boundary between Qatar and Saudi Arabia to the west is that described in the minutes of the joint meeting between the two countries in 2008.
 5. The Maritime boundary between Qatar and Saudi Arabia to the east is that described in the Agreement of 1965 on delimitation of the offshore and land boundaries which came into force on 31 May 1971.
 6. Numbers on the illustrative map refer to bay closing lines defined in Annex 1.
 7. The line drawn across the entrance of Ra's Laffan harbour connects the outermost points of the permanent harbour works.
