FINANCIAL REPORT AS AT 31 DECEMBER 2010 ON THE STATUS OF THE ASSISTANCE FUND UNDER PART VII OF THE AGREEMENT FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE UNITED NATIONS CONVENTION ON THE LAW OF THE SEA OF 10 DECEMBER 1982 RELATING TO THE CONSERVATION AND MANAGEMENT OF STRADDLING FISH STOCKS AND HIGHLY MIGRATORY FISH STOCKS¹

February 2011

1. Introduction

In November 2003, the United Nations General Assembly, in Resolution A/RES/58/14, established an Assistance Fund under Part VII of the Agreement for the Implementation of the Provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982 relating to the Conservation and Management of Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly Migratory Fish Stocks (1995 UN Fish Stocks Agreement), to assist developing States Parties in the implementation of the Agreement. It also decided that the Fund would be administered by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO). On 19 April 2005, the Fund was set up.² It is managed in accordance with the Fund's Terms of Reference and FAO's Financial Regulations as well as other applicable Rules.

2. Contributions to the Assistance Fund

The United Nations and FAO have continued to call for contributions to the Assistance Fund at international fora including Sessions of the United Nations General Assembly and the FAO Committee on Fisheries (COFI) as well as on the Assistance Fund's Website.³

As at 31 December 2010 the Governments of Canada, Iceland, Lebanon, New Zealand, Norway and the United States of America, all States Parties to the 1995 UN Fish Stocks Agreement, had made financial contributions to the Assistance Fund totalling USD 935,655. Table 1 shows contributions to the Fund together with accrued interest of USD 48,390. As at 31 December 2010 the Fund's total receipts were USD 984,045. In 2010 a contribution of USD 96,798 was received from the Government of Norway.

States, intergovernmental organizations, international financial institutions, national institutions, non-governmental organizations, as well as natural and juridical persons, wishing to make contributions to the Assistance Fund are encouraged to do so and they should direct their payments to the following FAO bank account:

3. Requests for Assistance from the Fund

Information about the existence and purpose of the Assistance Fund has been disseminated widely by the United Nations and FAO, including through electronic means, international meetings and contacts with relevant regional fisheries bodies. In 2010, 35 applications for travel were processed and funded. However, five applications were not funded because the one-month advance notice rule was not respected and one application was not processed because the request fell outside the Fund's terms of reference. A further six applications could not be processed because of inadequate resources available in the Fund. The total number of travel requests in 2010 (47 requests) increased over the level in 2009 (32 requests). In addition, the Panel of Experts was convened once in 2010.

Table 2 provides details of expenditure from the Assistance Fund as at 31 December 2010. Expenditure is categorized according to the purposes for which assistance is permitted and administrative expenses, as reflected, respectively, in paragraphs 14 and 21 of the Fund's Terms of Reference.

In 2010 total expenditure from the Fund was USD 316,398, which excludes 2010 unliquidated commitments of USD 5,385. Of the total expenditure of USD 316,398 in 2010:

- 41 percent supported participation in technical and annual sessions of regional and subregional fisheries management organizations and arrangements (Commission for the Conservation of Antarctic Marine Living Resources, Indian Ocean Tuna Commission, International Commission for the Conservation of Atlantic Tuna, South-East Atlantic Fisheries Organization and the Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission (WCPFC)) (paragraph 14 (a) of the Terms of Reference);
- 10 percent supported participation in meetings of global organizations (UN Resumed Conference of the States Parties to the 1995 UN Fish Stocks Agreement and the Kobe II Bycatch Workshop) (paragraph 14 (b) of the Terms of Reference);
- 46 percent supported capacity-development activities through three regional workshops addressing (i) the management of tuna data, (ii) tuna stock assessment, ecosystem and bycatch, and (iii) port State measures (paragraph 14 (f) of the Terms of Reference);
- 3 percent was devoted to administration, including mandatory FAO insurance expenses, staff overtime for processing requests and the preparation of FAO Letters of Agreement and a 6 percent project servicing cost for certain projects.

4. Panel of Experts

During 2010 the Panel of Experts was convened once. This was done to consider a request from the Pacific Islands Forum Fisheries Agency (FFA) to convene a workshop to (i) raise awareness of the 13 Pacific Island Parties to the 1995 UN Fish Stocks Agreement concerning the 2009 FAO Agreement on Port State Measures to Prevent, Deter an Eliminate Illegal,

Unreported and Unregulated Fishing and (ii) identify the appropriate framework for implementation of such measures including the elements of the proposed Port States Conservation and Management Measure of the WCPFC. The workshop was held in Honiara, Solomon Islands in September 2010. The funding for the workshop was requested by the Governments of Cook Islands, Kiribati, Nauru, Niue and Papua New Guinea. The request for funding was endorsed unanimously by the Panel.

5. Assistance Fund Travel Allocations by State Party

Table 3 provides an allocation of travel expenditure by State Party and by category of expenditure under paragraph 14 of the terms of reference for the period 2006 to 2010. The number of Parties securing funding increased in 2010 reflecting a small increase to 17 Parties (from 14 Parties in 2009). In addition, the funding in 2010 for travel increased by USD 5,676 over funding in the previous year.

6. Assistance Fund Allocations under FAO Letters of Agreement

In 2010 FAO entered into a Letter of Agreement⁴ with FFA. Table 4 provides details of the Letters of Agreement concluded by FAO and implemented in 2009 and 2010. The award of financial assistance under a Letter of Agreement results from an application for assistance that is considered and agreed by the Panel of Experts.

7. Assistance Fund Balance

As at 31 December 2010 the balance in the Assistance Fund was USD 58,057 (see Tables 1 and 2). However, taking account of funds committed for administrative expenses in 2011 (USD 4,500) and provision for a project in Mozambique (USD 65,000) that was approved by the Panel of Experts in 2009 but which has yet to be implemented, the Fund has currently a negative balance of approximately USD 11,400.

8. Conclusion

Over the duration of the Fund's operation from 2006 to 2010, 57 percent of expenditure was devoted to supporting Parties to the Agreement participate in RFMO and global meetings, 10 percent went to support Parties participate in negotiations for new RFMOs, 30 percent was directed to capacity development and 3 percent was for administrative and associated costs (Table 2).

The Assistance Fund was established, and is being managed, in accordance with its Terms of Reference and FAO's Financial Regulations and other applicable Rules. The United Nations and FAO encourage States, intergovernmental organizations, international financial institutions, national institutions, non-governmental organizations, as well as natural and juridical persons, to make voluntary financial contributions to the Fund. The United Nations and FAO seek to ensure that the Assistance Fund maintains a healthy funding level so that support for the implementation of the 1995 UN Fish Stocks Agreement can be sustained.
