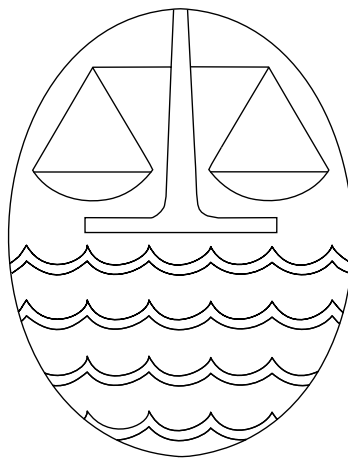

STATUS OF THE UNITED NATIONS CONVENTION ON THE LAW OF THE SEA, THE AGREEMENT RELATING TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PART XI OF THE CONVENTION, THE AGREEMENT FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE CONVENTION RELATING TO THE CONSERVATION AND MANAGEMENT OF STRADDLING FISH STOCKS AND HIGHLY MIGRATORY FISH STOCKS, AND THE AGREEMENT UNDER THE CONVENTION ON THE CONSERVATION AND SUSTAINABLE USE OF MARINE BIOLOGICAL DIVERSITY OF AREAS BEYOND NATIONAL JURISDICTION AS AT 30 NOVEMBER 2023¹

3. Depositary Notifications

(a) *Malaysia: Withdrawal of Declaration relating to article 298, 16 August 2023*⁶

“In accordance with Article 298, paragraph 2, of the 1982 United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS), the Government of Malaysia hereby withdraws with immediate effect its Declaration under Article 298, paragraph 1, of UNCLOS deposited on 26 August 2019 declaring that Malaysia did not accept any of the procedures provided for in Part XV, section 2 with respect to disputes concerning the interpretation or application of Articles 15, 74 and 83 relating to sea boundary delimitation or those involving historic bays or titles.”

(b) *United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland: Declarations under the Agreement under the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea on the Conservation and Sustainable Use of Marine Biological Diversity of Areas beyond National Jurisdiction, 20 September 2023*⁷

“In signing the Agreement, the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland (the “United Kingdom”) recalls Article 71 of the Agreement and has the honour to convey the following declarations:

1. The United Kingdom welcomes the general obligation to interpret and apply the BBNJ Agreement in a manner that promotes coherence and coordination with and that does not undermine other relevant instruments, frameworks and global, regional, subregional and sectoral bodies. In this context, the United Kingdom notes that the Antarctic Treaty system comprehensively addresses the legal, political and environmental considerations unique to that region and provides a comprehensive framework for the international management of the Antarctic.
2. The United Kingdom notes references in paragraph 8 of the Preamble to “the existing rights of Indigenous Peoples, including as set out in the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, or of, as appropriate, local communities,” and in Article 7(k) to “the rights of Indigenous Peoples or of, as appropriate, local communities”. The United Kingdom’s long-standing and well-established position, set out in its annual explanation of position at the UN General Assembly on the rights of indigenous people, is that human rights are held exclusively by individuals. With the exception of the right of self-determination (Common Article 1 of the two International Human Rights Covenants), the United Kingdom does not recognise collective human rights in international law. The United Kingdom consider this important in ensuring that individuals within groups are not left vulnerable or unprotected by allowing the rights of the groups to supersede the human rights of the individual. The United Kingdom therefore understands any internationally-agreed reference to the rights of indigenous peoples or local communities, including those in the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and, in the Agreement signed today, to refer to those rights bestowed by governments at the national level. The United Kingdom further understands the term “local communities” to be used consistently with the way it is used in the Convention on Biological Diversity.”

II. LEGAL INFORMATION RELEVANT TO THE UNITED NATIONS CONVENTION ON THE LAW OF THE SEA

BILATERAL TREATIES

1. *Agreement between the Polish People's Republic and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics on delimitation of the territorial sea (territorial waters), the economic zone, the maritime fishing zone and the continental shelf in the Baltic Sea, 17 July 1985*⁸

The State Council of the Polish People's Republic and the Presidium of the Supreme Soviet of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics,

Guided by the desire to deepen and expand the good-neighbourly and friendly relations between the Polish People's Republic and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics,

Mindful of the provisions of the Protocol between the Government of the Polish People's Republic and the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics concerning the delimitation of Polish and Soviet territorial waters in the Gulf of Gdansk of the Baltic Sea of 18 March 1958 and the Treaty between the Polish People's Republic and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics concerning the boundary of the continental shelf in the Gulf of Gdansk and the South-Eastern part of the Baltic Sea of 28 August 1969,

Recognizing that both Contracting Parties strive to conserve and make optimal use of natural resources and to safeguard other interests in accordance with international law, in the maritime spaces adjacent to their coasts,

Having regard to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 1982, to which both Contracting Parties are signatories,

Desiring to settle in a single agreement questions of maritime delimitation adjacent to the coasts of the Polish People's Republic and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics,

Have agreed as follows:

Article 1

The boundary of the territorial sea (territorial waters) between the Polish People's Republic and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics shall follow a straight line from a point on the Vistula Spit on the Polish-Soviet State boundary with geographical coordinates 54°27'28"63 northern latitude and 19°38'30"96 eastern longitude to the intersection of that line at 12 nautical miles with the outer limit of the territorial sea (territorial waters) of the Polish People's Republic and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics at a point with geographical coordinates 54°36'15" northern latitude and 19°24'22" eastern longitude.

Article 2

The boundary between the economic zones, the maritime fishing zones and the continental shelves between the Polish People's Republic and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics shall follow a line from a point with geographical coordinates 54°36'15" northern latitude, 19°24'22" eastern longitude, through points with the following geographical coordinates: [...] to the junction point of the maritime spaces of the Polish People's Republic, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Kingdom of Sweden.

Article 3

The boundaries defined in articles 1 and 2 have been marked on Polish nautical map No. 301, at a scale of 1:500,000, and Soviet nautical map No. 1150, at a scale of 1:500,000, which have been annexed to this Agreement.

Article 4

This Agreement shall replace the relevant provisions of the Protocol between the Government of the Polish People's Republic and the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics concerning the delimitation of Polish and Soviet territorial waters in the Gulf of Gdansk of the Baltic Sea of 18 March 1958 and the Treaty between the Polish People's Republic and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics concerning the boundary of the continental shelf in the Gulf of Gdansk and the South-Eastern part of the Baltic Sea of 28 August 1969.

Article 5

This Agreement shall be registered with the Secretariat of the United Nations in accordance with Article 102 of the Charter of the United Nations.

Article 6

This Treaty is subject to ratification and shall enter into force on the day of exchange of the instruments of ratification, which will occur in Warsaw at the earliest opportunity.

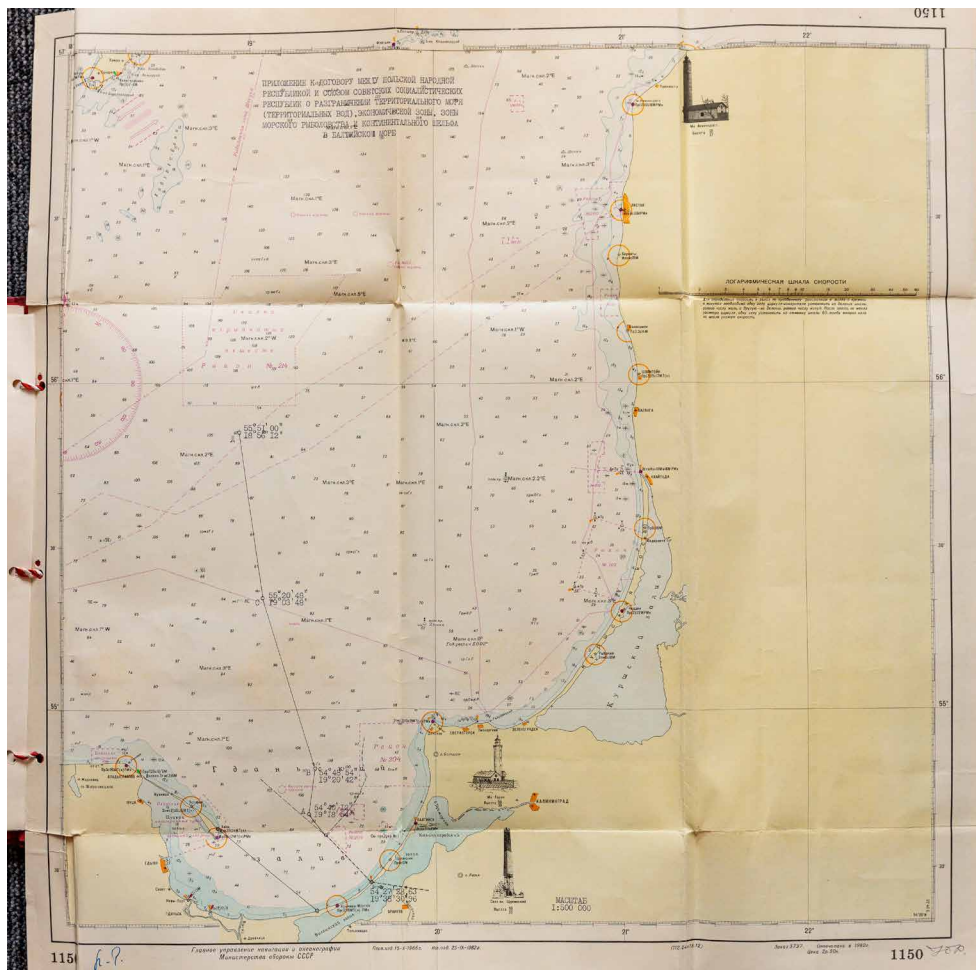

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE REPUBLIC OF FIJI AND SOLOMON ISLANDS CONCERNING THEIR MARITIME BOUNDARY

The Sovereign states of the Republic of Fiji ('Fiji') and Solomon Islands;

DESIRING to strengthen the bonds of friendship between the two States;

RECOGNIZING the need to effect a precise and equitable delimitation of the respective maritime areas in which the two States exercise sovereign rights;

BASING themselves on the rules and principles of relevant international law, as they are expressed in the United Nations Convention Law of the Sea, 10 December 1982 to which both Fiji and the Solomon Islands are a party, and, in particular Article 74 which provide that the delimitation of the exclusive economic zone between States with opposite or adjacent coasts shall be effected by agreement on the basis of international law, as referred to in Article 38 of the Statute of the International Court of Justice, in order to achieve an equitable solution; and

DESIROUS of establishing a clear maritime boundary between the Republic of Fiji and the Solomon Islands;

HAVE AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE 1

INTERPRETATION

In this Agreement unless the context otherwise requires: -

"Agreement" means this Agreement;

"continental shelf" in accordance with Part VI of UNCLOS, includes the seabed and subsoil of the submarine areas that extend beyond its territorial sea throughout the natural prolongation of its land territory to the outer edge of the continental margin, or to a distance of 200 nautical miles from the baselines from which the breadth of the territorial sea is measured where the outer edge of the continental margin does not extend up to that distance in accordance with Part VI of UNCLOS;

"EEZ" means the Exclusive Economic Zones measured 200 nautical miles from the baselines of each Party as referred to under with Part V of UNCLOS;

"Parties" means the Republic of Fiji and the Solomon Islands; and

"UNCLOS" means the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea 1982.

ARTICLE 2

Purpose

The purpose of this Agreement is to establish in accordance with international law, the maritime boundary between the Republic of Fiji and the Solomon Islands.

ARTICLE 3

Maritime Boundary between Fiji and Solomon Islands

(1) The line of delimitation between the exclusive economic zones and continental shelves over which each State respectively exercises sovereign rights and jurisdiction in accordance with international law lies seaward of Fatutaka in the Solomon Islands and Rotuma in Fiji respectively, along geodesics connecting the following geographical coordinates of points ('points'), defined by their coordinates in the order stated below:

(2) The line of delimitation referred to in paragraph 1 of this Article is the equidistance line between Fiji and the Solomon Islands.

(3) The geographical coordinates given in this Agreement are determined by reference to the geodetic reference system WGS 84 (World Geodetic Reference System 1984).

(4) The boundary line drawn on the chart in the Annexure to this Agreement is drawn for illustrative purposes only.

ARTICLE 4

Without Prejudice

This Agreement will not prejudice any further negotiations with Solomon Islands relating to international law, the law of the sea including those to do with the regional cooperation, waters, seabed or areas of continental shelf areas.

ARTICLE 5

Sovereign Rights

The lines described in Article 3 of this Agreement shall be the maritime boundary between the areas referred to in Article 3 in which Parties, in accordance with international law and Article 56 of UNCLOS shall exercise their sovereign rights or jurisdiction.

ARTICLE 6

Adjustments to Maritime Boundary

If new surveys or resulting charts and maps should indicate that changes in the base point coordinates are sufficiently significant to require adjustments of the maritime boundary, the Parties agree that an adjustment will be carried out on the basis of the same principles as those used in determining the maritime boundary, and such adjustments shall be provided for in a Protocol to this Agreement.

ARTICLE 7

Dispute Resolution

Any dispute between the parties concerning the interpretation or application of this Agreement shall be settled peacefully through consultation and negotiations between the Parties or through negotiation in accordance with international law as agreed to by the Parties.

ARTICLE 8

Equitable Benefit from Resource Exploitation

If any single accumulation or deposit of liquid hydrocarbon, natural gas, or other mineral lies on the maritime boundary median line, the accumulation or deposit of such resources shall be effectively exploited by either or both Parties and both Parties shall equitably share the benefits of such resource exploitation.

ARTICLE 9

Agreement Deposit

Upon the completion of all national procedures bringing this Agreement into force, each party shall take all the necessary steps to lodge this Agreement, including the coordinates in Article 1, with the appropriate international bodies.

ARTICLE 10


Entry into Force

Each Party shall notify the other of the completion of its national procedures to bring this Agreement into force. This Agreement shall enter into force on the date of the later note in an exchange of notes between Parties indicating that each Party has completed its national procedures for the entry into force of this Agreement.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the representatives of the two Governments, being duly authorized for this purpose, have signed this Agreement and have affixed thereto their seals.

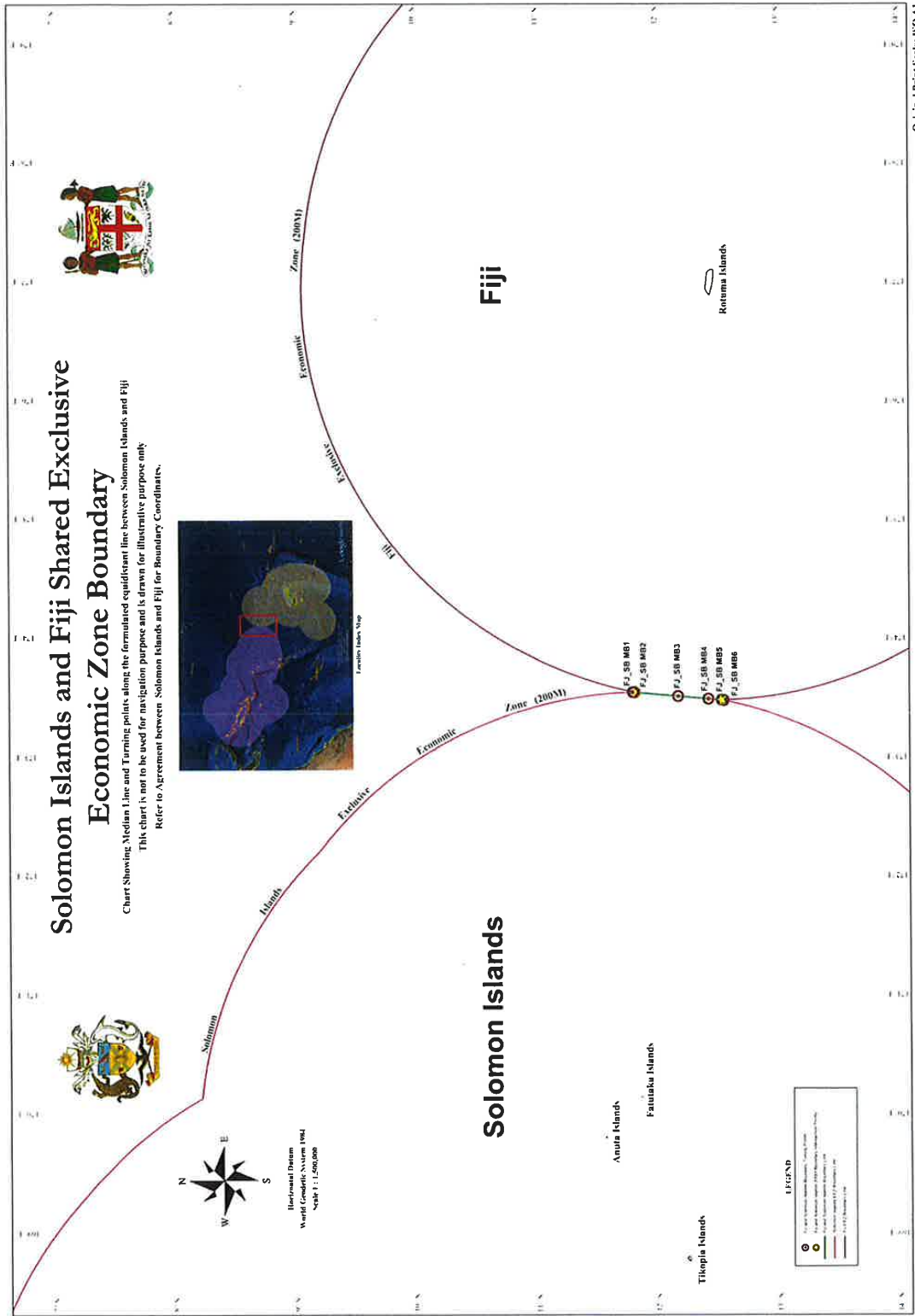
