UNDP contribution

Section X. Capacity building and technical assistance to States:

In 2021-2022, UNDP supported a wide range of ocean-related capacity building and technical assistance activities in over 80 UNDP programme countries. This included support to advancing area-based ocean and coastal management through Marine Spatial Planning, Integrated Coastal Management, Marine Protected Areas, Large Marine Ecosystem approach and Locally Managed Marine Areas. UNDP continued its long-term support to the management and governance of the West and Central Pacific tuna fishery, the world's largest, that is rated as 100% sustainable since 2019. UNDP supported and mobilized resources for 15 countries, including all 7 AIS SIDS, in the development of their Blue Economy assessments, policies, strategies and plans. Through a broad-based global competition, UNDP's Ocean Innovation Challenge identified, financed, mentored and incubated some twenty entities piloting and scaling up transformational innovations that address marine pollution and sustainable fisheries challenges. UNDP is also a founding partner of the Global Fund for Coral Reefs and is playing a leading role in the development and implementation of the Fund's policy architecture and knowledge management system, strategic partnerships, and flagship programming. During the reporting period, UNDP mobilized a total of \$29.148 million in new financial resources for ocean-related capacity building and technical assistance to States.
