The Permanent Mission of Germany to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Office of Legal Affairs of the United Nations and, referring to the latter's request for information (DOALOS/STUDY/2007 dated 22 January 2007) has the honour to submit information on German support to developing countries as follows:

- 1. With a view to ensuring the sustainable use of marine resources, Germany recommends the following measures for consideration by developing countries:
 - (1) Revise national fisheries policy framework to ensure the sustainable and equitable use of fisheries resources (legal and regulatory framework).
 - (2) Participate in and support to Regional Fisheries Management Organisations (RFMO) to enhance regional collaboration.
 - (3) Strengthen all relevant national institutions involved in fisheries management with regards to their organisational, managerial, technical and financial abilities to foster adequate steering capacities.
 - (4) Review and strengthen the national system for delivery of relevant services with regards to fisheries management to ensure effective and efficient services delivery to the respective clients within the sector.

- (5) Introduce co-management systems and delegate fisheries management authority to (decentralized) co-management institutions to foster adequate ownership of and motivation for a responsible use of natural resources at local levels.
- (6) Provide appropriate infrastructure for post-harvest facilities (for seafood landings, storage, transportation and processing) to maximise the potential benefits from the sector.
- (7) Establish/Improve the national system for Monitoring, Control and Surveillance in the respective area of maritime jurisdiction to ensure compliance with the relevant national and international regulatory frameworks in general and to combat Illegal, Unregulated and Unreported (IUU) fishing in particular.
- (8) Establish and manage adequate Marine Protected Areas (MPA) within the limits of national jurisdiction to ensure appropriate critical areas/habitats are protected from any anthropogenic disturbing influence.
- (9) Design Coastal Area Profiles with an emphasis on vulnerabilities and potential hazards as well as their consequences from natural events/disasters (e.g. storms, tidal waves, sea level rise) to generate the relevant baselinedata for an adequate Disaster Risk Management.
- (10) Strengthen relevant national scientific research institutions with regards to fisheries management to build the necessary academic facilities, capacities and abilities for essential education as well as research.
- 2. As to projects in the area of sustainable fisheries the Federal Ministry of Economic Cooperation and Development of Germany (BMZ) currently supports the following projects:
