#### The Crossroads

- Rio+20 demands a high level of ambition
- A milestone, it offers a unique opportunity to galvanize political will and commitment
- Constituencies, stakeholders, demand vision and leadership, not just "launching a process"
- … there is no hidden agenda…...



## Moving beyond the Divide

- The polarization of multilateralism
- Need to reaffirm common stewardship, common agendas
- "They have different priorities from us"
- Platform for cooperation –strengthening the global partnership
- Need for confidence-building measures
- Need to focus on concrete issues



## **Challenges**

- Need mechanisms to address complex, multi-dimensional, multi-sectoral issues
- Climate change to Security Council... next...food security?
- Demographic dynamics
- Trade-offs



## **Guiding characteristics**

- Universal
- Differentiated approaches (flexibility)
- Agenda setting but not prescriptive
- Poverty as overarching goal
- Focus on implementation
- Few in number, simple, easy to communicate
- 3 D
- Interlinkages among SDGs





#### The Road Ahead

- A single process with a single set of global development goals
- Rio+1 will be defined by what we can achieve by June 2012
- MDG process "will not be repeated"
- Country-driven
- "Going too fast"....be wary of the dangers of a fully open-ended process



## The Proposal

- By Rio
  - Definition of at least the priority areas
  - Definition of the cross-cutting issues, including Mol
- In Rio
  - Launch a time-bound, science-driven process, informed by expertise from countries and agencies.



#### The Process

- Establish an ad hoc expert group for each SDG
- The recommendations from these expert groups would be taken up by the UNGA in 2013
- Mandate would include:
- ✓ purpose and long-term vision for SDGs
- √ key characteristics to guide their development
- ✓ architecture
- ✓ recommendations on how SDGs could contribute to the post 2015 development agenda
