

Financial situation of the United Nations Statement

Madam Chair,

I would like to update the Committee on developments since last week's briefing.

For the regular budget, Barbados, Chile, Republic of Moldova, San Marino and Vanuatu have paid in full, bringing the total number of Member States having paid in full for the regular budget to 96.

For peacekeeping operations, Cuba, Ireland, Malawi and Rwanda have paid in full all due peacekeeping assessments, which brings the total number of Member States having paid in full for peacekeeping operations to 51.

For the International Tribunals, Burundi, Malawi, Rwanda, Thailand, United Kingdom and Vanuatu have paid in full, bringing the total number of Member States who paid in full for this category to 73.

In addition, as indicated in paragraph 26 of the report (A/73/443/Add.1) which is now before you, Cuba, Ireland, Malawi and Rwanda are now fully paid for all categories. This brings the total to 44 Member States.

On behalf of the Secretary-General, I would like to thank these Member States for their positive action since last week's briefing on the UN financial situation.
