Mr. Chairman,

I would like to update the Committee on developments since last week's briefing.

For the regular budget, Haiti and Niger have paid in full, bringing the total number of Member States having paid in full for the regular budget to 101.

For peacekeeping operations, Algeria, Georgia, Japan, Niger and Tuvalu have paid in full all due peacekeeping assessments, which brings the total number of Member States having paid in full for peacekeeping operations to 58.

For the International Tribunals, Algeria and Niger have paid in full, bringing the total number of Member States who paid in full for this category to 79.

As a result of recent payments from Georgia, Japan and Niger, they are now fully paid for all categories and are reflected in paragraph 31 of the report (A/75/387/Add.1) which is now before you. Subsequent to the issuance of this report, payments were received from Algeria and Tuvalu, and these Member States are now fully paid for all categories. This brings the total to 52 Member States.

In addition, payments have been received from the following Member States:

For the regular budget, Afghanistan and Libya.

For peacekeeping operations, Afghanistan and Italy.

For the tribunals, Afghanistan.

On behalf of the Secretary-General, I would like to thank these Member States for their positive action since last week's briefing on the UN financial situation.
