Special measures for protection from sexual exploitation and sexual abuse (A/76/702)**

Mr. Chairperson, distinguished delegates,

I have the honor to introduce the Secretary-General's report on special measures for protection from sexual exploitation and abuse (A/76/702), covering the period from 1 January to 31 December 2021.

As requested in General Assembly resolutions 71/278 and 71/297, the report provides information on measures taken to strengthen the system-wide response to sexual exploitation and abuse, including progress in implementation of the zero-tolerance policy and the Secretary-General's enhanced strategy outlined six years ago in A/71/818 and further addressed in A/72/751, A/73/744, A/74/705 and in A/75/754.

The report provides updates on the implementation of the four-pronged strategy, prioritizing the rights and dignity of victims; ending impunity through strengthened reporting and investigations; engaging with Member States, civil society and external partners; and improving strategic communication for education and transparency. It also contextualizes the efforts put forth to eradicate sexual exploitation and abuse and identifying and mitigating associated risks while still facing the challenges associated with the COVID-19 pandemic in 2021. Furthermore, this report outlines the various initiatives that have been put in place by the members of the High-Level Steering Group and other UN entities, to continue engagement and cohesion across the United Nations system, as well as engagement with member states.

Following the format of the reports introduced in the past four years, the content of the report focuses on the Secretary-General's strategy for combatting sexual exploitation and abuse. Accordingly, supplementary information has been provided (in a separate document) which contains statistics and general information on allegations of sexual exploitation and abuse relating to personnel in peacekeeping and special political missions, personnel and implementing partners in other United Nations entities, and non-United Nations international forces authorized by a Security Council mandate.
