C.S.M. MSELLE OF UNITED REPUBLIC OF TANZANIA ELECTED CHAIRMAN
OF FIFTH COMMITTEE (ADMINISTRATIVE AND BUDGETARY)

Conrad S.M. Mselle, who was today elected as Chairman of the Fifth Committee (Administrative and Budgetary), has served since early this year as Director of Administration and Personnel of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the United Republic of Tanzania.

He was born in 1938, and obtained the degree of B.A. (Hons.) London before joining his country's diplomatic corps in 1964.

He then served in the following posts: Assistant Research Officer, 1964; Third Secretary, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, 1966-1968; Second Secretary at the Tanzania Embassy in Cairo, 1968-1969; First Secretary and Head of Chancery, Permanent Mission of the United Republic of Tanzania to the United Nations, 1969-1971; Counsellor at the Permanent Mission, 1972-1973; and Director of Administration and Personnel, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, 1973.

Since 1966, Mr. Mselle has attended the sessions of the General Assembly. He was his country's representative in the Fifth Committee in 1967-1972 and has served as Rapporteur of the Committee for Programme and Co-ordination (CPC), 1970-1971, and as a member of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (ACABQ).

He also served as his country's representative in the Special Committee of 24 on decolonization, the Governing Council of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the Commission on Human Rights. He has also participated in various seminars, panels and conferences organized by the United Nations and the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR).
