

- Japan established relevant domestic laws necessary for the implementation of the Convention on Cluster Munitions, such as, the Act to prohibit and regulate production and possession of cluster munitions, and concluded this Convention on 14 July 2009.
- 2. The Government of Japan has provided assistance for carrying out the activities to clear unexploded ordnances, including land mines and cluster munitions, as well as to assist the victims of these munitions. Since 1998, the total amount of the assistance extended to 44 countries and regions is approximately 420 million USD(approximately 40 billion JYP). Japan continues to play a proactive role in this area, and encourages other countries to conclude this Convention in collaboration with civil society, in order to advance the legal norm to ban cluster munitions in the international community,
