70TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE GENEVA CONVENTIONS

Concept Note: High-Level Side Event on "Investing in Humanity through Multilateralism"

Background:

With the aim to preserve the core of our humanity during the worst of times, the four Geneva Conventions of 1949 are central to international humanitarian law and the international legal order. In the aftermath of the Second World War, States recognized that wars must be waged within certain limits to safeguard the lives and dignity of human beings, and they have since been universally ratified. They embody common values that transcend legal traditions, civilizations and cultures.

The Geneva Conventions continue to bring to life the idea of investing in humanity through multilateralism. This is an idea that is also embodied in the creation of the United Nations, as the preamble to the UN Charter starts off with, "We the peoples of the United Nations determined to save succeeding generations from the scourge of war which twice in our lifetime has brought untold sorrow to mankind…" In addition, the purposes of the United Nations as stated in the UN Charter include to achieve international cooperation in solving international problems of a humanitarian character.

This event will enable Member States to promote a global order based on international law as highlighted by the Secretary-General of the United Nations.

The Geneva Conventions place people and their needs at the center and protect the most vulnerable from the harmful effects of contemporary warfare. With its people-centered focus, the Geneva Conventions have stood the test of time and remain relevant 70 years on as commitments for the future.

Objectives:

- Demonstrate the universality of the Geneva Conventions through the participation of Member States widely.
- ❖ Highlight how the Geneva Conventions can protect our common humanity.
- Discuss how the Geneva Conventions and other core IHL treaties provide a framework to address contemporary and emerging challenges.
