BACKGROUND

The side-event on the "International Law Commission (ILC) Twenty Years After the Adoption of the Articles on Responsibility of States for Internationally Wrongful Acts (ARSIWA)" intends to offer a reflection on the evolution of the ILC and its achievements two decades after the adoption of its landmark text on State responsibility (UNGA Resolution 56/83, 12 December 2001). It will also provide an opportunity to discuss the future of the ARSIWA, one year ahead of the next debate within the UNGA Sixth Committee on the topic.

The format of the side-event is designed to encourage an informed exchange of ideas and lively debate. Each topic will be briefly introduced by an eminent expert and discussed among the panelists. The floor will then be open to the audience for questions and comments.
