The Permanent Mission of the Republic of Singapore to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Office of Legal Affairs of the United Nations and has the honour to refer to the latter's Note LA/COD/11/1 dated 9 January 2025, inviting Member States to provide data on the status and implementation of existing multilateral, regional and bilateral agreements relating to international terrorism, including information on incidents caused by international terrorism and criminal prosecutions and sentencing.

The Permanent Mission of Singapore has the further honour to convey that since our last submission in 2022, Singapore has strengthened legislative levers to block access to online extremist and terrorist messaging and ideologies. For example, the amended Broadcasting Act (effective since February 2023) and the Online Criminal Harms Act (effective since February 2024) allow Singapore to disable access to egregious or criminal content online, including those that advocate and instruct on terrorism and those that incite violence.

Singapore continues to implement and strengthen our targeted financial sanctions regime to comply with the United Nations Security Council resolutions (UNSCRs) relating to the prevention and suppression of terrorism and terrorist financing, such as UNSCR 1267 and its successor resolutions, and UNSCR 1373. The following individuals have been added to the list of terrorists under the Terrorism (Suppression of Financing) Act 2002 since 2022 and are subjected to targeted financial sanctions: on 30 September 2024, three Singapore citizens, namely, Radjev Lal s/o Madan Lal, Mohamed Khairul Riduan bin Mohamed Sarip, and Muhammad Irfan Danyal Bin Mohamad; on 11 February 2025, three Singapore citizens, namely, Muhammad Indra Aqmal bin Effendy, Mohamad Latiff bin Rahim, and Nurisham bin Yusoff; and on 2 April 2025, one Singapore citizen, Nick Lee Xing Qiu.

Since 2016, Singapore has successfully prosecuted and convicted 13 individuals for terrorism financing under the Terrorism (Suppression of Financing) Act 2002.

The Permanent Mission of the Republic of Singapore to the United Nations avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Office of Legal Affairs of the United Nations the assurances of its highest consideration.
