ORDER No. 60 (2011)

1. On 22 June 2011, the United Nations Dispute Tribunal (Dispute Tribunal or UNDT) issued Judgment No. UNDT/2011/105 in the case of *Al-Mulla v. Secretary-General of the United Nations*. Pursuant to Article 7(1)(c) of the Statute of the Appeals Tribunal (Statute), an appeal must be filed within 45 days of the receipt of the judgment of the Dispute Tribunal. Accordingly, the time limit for filing an appeal in this case expires on 6 August 2011.
2. On 3 August 2011, Mohammed Al-Mulla (Al-Mulla) filed a request for a 3-weeks extension of time to file his appeal on the grounds that his counsel is assisting other clients while also experiencing “intermittent computer problems”.
3. I have considered Al-Mulla’s request and do not believe that his request constitutes an exceptional case warranting a 3-weeks extension of the time limit as provided for by our Statute.
4. For the foregoing reason, I deny Al-Mulla’s request and order that his appeal, if any, is due by 9 August 2011.
