REQUEST FOR WITHDRAWAL OF APPEAL

1. The United Nations Appeals Tribunal (Appeals Tribunal) is seized of an appeal, filed by the Secretary-General on 10 June 2011 against Judgment No. UNDT/2011/076, rendered by the United Nations Dispute Tribunal on 29 April 2011. In relation to this appeal, the Appeals Tribunal is also seized of a motion to withdraw the appeal, filed by the Secretary-General on 23 September 2011.

2. A party may withdraw an appeal simply by giving notice and need not necessarily provide any further justification. I see no reason to require the Secretary-General to pursue an appeal he no longer deems necessary in the context of his case.
