SECRETARY-GENERAL'S REQUEST FOR WITHDRAWAL OF APPEAL

- 1. The United Nations Appeals Tribunal (Appeals Tribunal) is seized of an appeal, filed by the Secretary-General on 11 April 2011 against a judgment rendered by the United Nations Dispute Tribunal (UNDT or Dispute Tribunal) in the case of *Amar v. Secretary-General of the United Nations.* On 15 December 2011, the Secretary-General requested the withdrawal of the appeal. On 16 December 2011, Ms. Meryem Amar notified the Appeals Tribunal that a settlement agreement had been reached between the parties and that she supported the withdrawal of the appeal.
- 2. A party may withdraw an appeal simply by giving notice and need not necessarily provide any further justification.² I see no reason to require the Secretary-General to pursue an appeal he no longer deems necessary in the context of his case.
- 3. For the foregoing reason, I grant the Secretary-General's request and declare the appeal moot.
