ORDER No. 206 (2014)

1. On 1 August 2014, the United Nations Dispute Tribunal issued Judgment No. UNDT/2014/109 in the case of *Harrich v. Secretary-General of the United Nations*. Mr. Martin Harrich filed an appeal to the United Nations Appeals Tribunal (Appeals Tribunal) on 28 October 2014.

2. On 11 November 2014, Mr. Harrich filed a motion seeking leave to file additional pleadings (Motion). Specifically, he sought permission to add two sentences to paragraph 4 of his appeal brief. On 11 November 2014, the Secretary-General advised the Appeal Tribunal that he had “no comments” on the Motion.

3. I note that the amendment to the appeal brief will not prejudice any right or interest of the Respondent because the Secretary-General will have an opportunity to file an answer to the amended appeal. Nor will allowing the amendment unreasonably delay the proceedings before this Tribunal.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, pursuant to Articles 18*bis*(1) and 31(1) of the Rules of Procedure of the Appeals Tribunal, Mr. Harrich's Motion IS GRANTED. The Registry is instructed to accept the appeal brief as amended by Mr. Harrich as part of his submission.
