

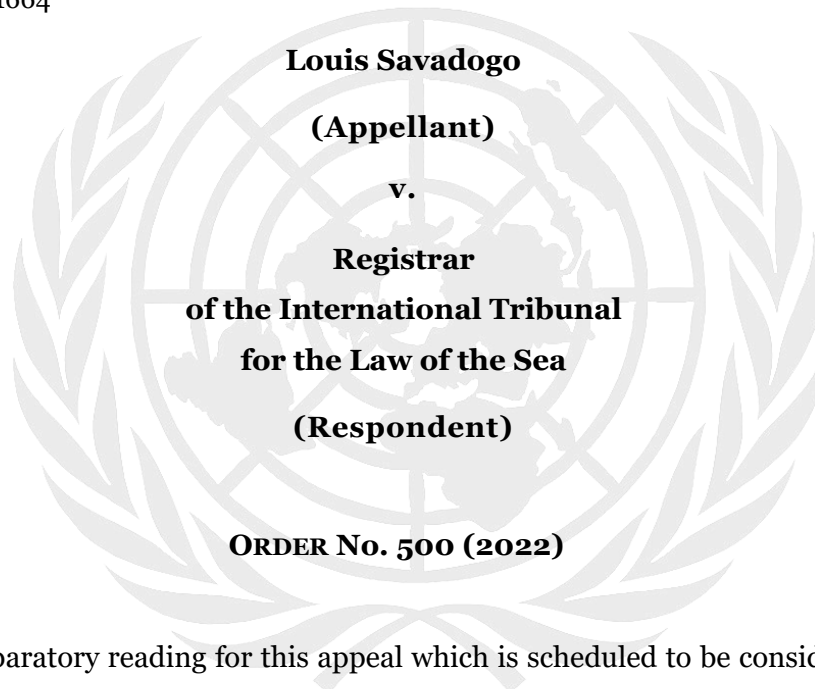

**ORDER No. 500 (2022)**

1. In preparatory reading for this appeal which is scheduled to be considered in the Spring (March) 2023 sitting of the United Nations Appeals Tribunal (UNAT), I have noted that Mr. Savadogo (Appellant), in his submissions in support of his appeal, seeks that the UNAT direct that a number of documents be disclosed to him by the Registrar of the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea (Respondent).
2. The Respondent has opposed the production of these documents on a number of grounds.
3. It appears that disclosure of these documents is sought to support Mr. Savadogo's appeal. To direct their disclosure (if the UNAT were to do so) as part of deciding his appeal, would have limited or no benefit to the decision of the appeal which would be taken at the same time.
4. If, therefore, Mr. Savadogo seeks to have disclosed and produced any particular document or documents in support of his appeal (and without now determining the admissibility of these), I direct that this must be claimed by interlocutory motion filed no later than 12 noon on 20 January 2023 (New York time).

5. The Respondent may have until 12 noon on 10 February 2023 (New York time) to file any submissions in response.

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED accordingly.**
