Counsel for respondent: James Provenzano 1. Having carefully reviewed the submissions of the Parties, the Tribunal finds that the Parties have omitted to provide it with a clear schedule of :

- a) start and end-dates for **each** of the Applicant's appointments (SSA and CA) between October 2004 and November 2007;
- b) whether travel entitlements attached for each of the appointments;
- c) whether the travel entitlements were exercised or waived, with dates for the same; and
- d) the amount(s) paid to the Applicant by way of assignment and/or relocation grants at each appointment.

2. The Tribunal finds that these facts are pertinent to the dispute at hand, and necessary for a just determination of the matter.

3. Accordingly, in accordance with the provision of Article 18 (2) of the UNDT Rules of Procedure¹, the Tribunal directs the Parties to file its submissions in respect of (a) to (e) above by **Friday**, **5 February 2010**.
