Introduction and Procedural History

1. At the time of the application, the Applicant served as a Security Officer at the

United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilisation Mission in Mali

("MINUSMA"). He held a fixed term appointment at the FS-4 level and was based in

Bamako.

2. On 21 December 2018, the Applicant challenged the Respondent's decision to

separate him from service with compensation in lieu of notice without termination

indemnity in accordance with staff rule 10.2(a)(viii). It is the Applicant's case that the

facts of the allegations on which the impugned decision was made were not established

so that there is no basis for a finding of misconduct; that due process was violated and

the resulting sanction was disproportionate.

3. The Respondent filed his reply to the application on 25 January 2019.

4. The Respondent submits that the impugned decision was based on clear and

convincing evidence that the Applicant's conduct amounted to serious misconduct in

violation of staff regulation 1.2(b) and (f), staff rule 1.2(e) and section 3.1 of

ST/SGB/2003/13 on the Special Measures for Protection from Sexual Exploitation and

Abuse.

Considerations and Order

5. The Tribunal considers that a case management discussion ("CMD") would

facilitate fair, efficient and expeditious management and disposal of this case.

6. A CMD will take place on Monday, 4 May 2020 at 2.00 p.m. (Nairobi Time,

UTC +3) using Skype or Microsoft Teams. At the CMD, the Tribunal and the parties

a. Ascertain whether the parties are amenable to considering an alternative resolution to the dispute;

- b. Discuss the claims and issues in the case;
- c. Identify the factual and legal issues to be determined;
- d. Consider what further information, if any, is required;
- e. Identify any documents to be disclosed;
- f. Consider if the case may be decided on the basis of the documents, or whether a hearing should be held, and, if there is to be a hearing, to set the dates, identify the witnesses to be called and the documents to be presented; and
- g. Discuss any other matter relevant to these proceedings.
- 7. As this case management discussion is being held virtually with all parties appearing from their respective locations, counsel are requested to provide the Registry with the relevant contact details no later than **24 April 2020**.
