# **ORDER ON CASE MANAGEMENT**

### Introduction

1. On 10 February 2020, the Applicant, a former Political Affairs Officer, at the P-4, step 9 level, working with the United Nations Mission for the Referendum in Western Sahara ("MUNURSO") in Laayoune, filed an application before the Dispute Tribunal.<sup>1</sup> He contests a disciplinary measure of separation from service, with compensation in lieu of notice and without termination indemnity.<sup>2</sup>

2. The Respondent filed a reply on 28 February 2020.

3. In view of the submissions by the parties, the Tribunal has decided to hold a case management discussion ("CMD"). The purpose of the CMD is to establish the disputed facts and the need for adducing evidence in light of the reply.

## ORDERS

4. A CMD in this case will take place on **Monday**, **16 November 2020 at 1500 hours** (Nairobi Time, UTC +3) via Microsoft Teams.

5. The parties or their duly designated representatives must attend the CMD. The Registry will provide a link to access the meeting.
