# **ORDER ON CASE MANAGEMENT**

**Counsel for the Applicant:** Self-represented

## Introduction

1. On 17 October 2019, the Applicant, a former Programme Analyst, at the G-7 level, working with the United Nations Development Programme ("UNDP") in Djibouti, filed an application before the Dispute Tribunal.<sup>1</sup> He contests the disciplinary measure of separation from service with compensation in lieu of notice and with two months' termination indemnity.<sup>2</sup>

2. The Respondent filed a reply on 7 November 2019.

3. In light of the submissions by the parties, the Tribunal is considering having a hearing in May 2021.

## ORDER

## 4. **On or before 30 April 2021**, the parties shall:

- a. Confirm if they intend to lead oral evidence. If yes, they should state their availability for a hearing during the week of 24 May 2021;
- Submit the lists of witnesses they intend to call to give oral evidence during the hearing. The lists should include the contact information (telephone numbers-landline and mobile or skype details) for each witness;
- c. State whether interpretation/translation into English is required for any of them; and
- d. Provide a summary of facts for which the witnesses are supposed to testify.
