## **ORDER ON CASE MANAGEMENT**

Introduction

1. The Applicant held a fixed-term appointment at the GS-3 level, when he

served as an administrative clerk/dispatcher at the United Nations Development

Programme's Programme of Assistance to the Palestinian People (UNDP/PAPP).

She was based in East Jerusalem.

2. On 6 August 2020, the Applicant filed an application with the United Nations

Dispute Tribunal sitting in Nairobi to challenge the Respondent's decision to not

renew her appointment beyond 31 March 2020. It is the Applicant's case that the

impugned decision was retaliatory, made in response to his whistleblowing; and

that the decision to abolish the post encumbered by the Applicant was tainted by

extraneous factors and therefore unlawful.

3. The Respondent filed his reply to the application on 9 September 2020. The

Respondent takes the position that the application is materially not receivable by

the Tribunal and is time-barred. The decisions to abolish his post and therefore not

renew his appointment, the Respondent further contends, were lawfully made; and

that the Applicant's allegations of bad faith have not been borne out by the

evidence.

**Orders** 

4. The Tribunal considers that a case management discussion ("CMD") would

facilitate fair, efficient and expeditious management and disposal of this case.

5. A CMD will take place on Wednesday, 12 May 2021 at 2.30 p.m. (Nairobi

**time)** using Microsoft Teams. At the CMD, the Tribunal and the parties will:

a. Ascertain whether the parties are amenable to this matter being resolved

informally or through mediation;

b. Identify the factual and legal issues to be determined;

c. Consider if the case may be decided on the basis of the parties' written

submissions; and

d. Discuss any other matter relevant to these proceedings.

6. The Tribunal considers it necessary to afford the Applicant the opportunity to

respond to the Respondent's reply. The Applicant is directed to file these

submissions by 12 May 2021.

7. As this CMD is being held virtually, the parties are requested to provide the

Registry with their contact details by 11 May 2021.
