# **ORDER ON CASE MANAGEMENT**

### Introduction

1. The Applicant filed an application on 30 January 2020 to contest the decision to impose on her the disciplinary measure of separation from service with compensation *in lieu* of notice without termination indemnity, in accordance with staff rules 10.1(a) and 10.2(a)(viii).

2. The Respondent filed a reply on 4 March 2020.

3. On 26 October 2020, the Tribunal issued Order No. 209 (NBI/2020), where, *inter alia*, it directed the parties to indicate whether the case can be decided on the documents or whether an oral hearing is necessary.

4. On 4 and 5 November 2020, both parties responded to Order No. 209 (NBI/2020) and submitted that they do not require oral hearing and will not be filing any additional documents in respect to this case.

## DIRECTIONS

5. In light of the above and in accordance with the parties' preferences:

a. The Tribunal will proceed to adjudicate the case based on the documents on file; and

b. Should the parties wish to file any closing submissions, they may do so by **5.00 pm (Nairobi time) on 15 June 2022.** The submissions should be limited to **three** pages.
