Introduction

1. By Order No. 166 (NBI/2023) issued on 2 November 2023, the Tribunal granted the Applicant's motion for translation into French of all the documents filed by the Respondent in his 23 October 2023 submission.
2. On 26 February 2024, the translated documents were uploaded into the Court Case Management System and transmitted to the Applicant.
3. On 27 March 2024, the Applicant submitted comments on the Respondent's submission dated 23 October 2023.

Consideration

4. Having reviewed the evidence on record and the parties' submissions to date, the Tribunal considers itself sufficiently informed to render its judgment without the need for additional disclosure of evidence or the holding of a hearing on the merits.
5. Pursuant to art. 19 of the Tribunal's Rules of Procedure, and for the fair disposal of the case, the parties are instructed to file their respective closing submission. Upon the filing of closing submissions, the Tribunal will move forward with adjudicating the case.

Conclusion

6. In view of the foregoing, it is ORDERED that:
 - a. By **Thursday, 30 May 2024**, the parties shall file their respective closing submission;
