ORDER ON THE APPLICANT'S MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE AN APPLICATION

Counsel for Respondent: OHCHR 1. The Applicant is a Human Rights Officer with the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights ("OHCHR"). On 16 December 2024, she filed a motion for an extension of time to file an application ("the motion"). In the motion, the Applicant stated that she needed one extra month to file her application on the merits.

2. However, on 17 December 2024, the Applicant filed her application on the merits before the Tribunal ruled on the motion for an extension.¹

3. Since the management evaluation is dated 21 October 2024, the application was due to be filed by 19 January 2025 in accordance with art. 8(d)(i)(a) of the Tribunal's Statute.

4. Having timely filed an application on the merits, the motion for extension is moot.

IT IS ORDERED THAT

5. The motion for an extension of time to file an application is dismissed as moot.
