## **Introduction**

1. On 27 November 2018, the Applicant, a former Programme Management Assistant at the G-5 level, step 6, in the Office for Counter-Terrorism, filed an application on the merits contesting the decision to not extend her short-term appointment beyond its expiration date. This case is currently under review before the Tribunal.

2. On 1 March 2019, by Order No. 44 (NY/2019), the Tribunal rejected two motions for interim measures requested by the Applicant. In this Order, the Tribunal recalled that it had directed the Applicant to seek leave before filing any further motions in this case and cautioned her against abusing the process by filing submissions on matters already decided by the Tribunal.

3. On 4 March 2019, the Applicant filed a new motion seeking leave to file a motion for correction. In her motion, the Applicant states that, in Order No. 44 (NY/2019), the Tribunal wrongly referenced Order No. 29 (NY/2019) instead of Order No. 24 (NY/2019). The Applicant goes on to raise further issues unrelated to the request for correction.

## **Consideration**

4. As the Applicant rightly points out, the Tribunal indeed directed her to seek leave before filing additional motions in Order No. 24 (NY/2019). However, as Order No. 44 (NY/2019) correctly indicates, the Applicant ignored the Tribunal's instructions

by filing a motion for intervention on 28 February 2019. The Tribunal sees no need to issue any further orders or clarifications on this matter.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

5. The motion is rejected.
6. The Applicant shall not file any further motions in this case unless so directed by the Tribunal.
