1. On 1 May 2020, the Respondent sought leave to submit two additional pieces of documentary evidence: email correspondence between the former Chief of the Human Resources Section of the International Criminal Tribunals (“RMICT”) and the Applicant and photographs showing the location of the RMICT clinic in the former premises in Arusha. The Respondent states that this evidence is relevant as it rebuts evidence previously submitted by the Applicant.

2. The Tribunal finds the evidence to be *prima facie* relevant and accepts its submission into the case file. The Tribunal further finds that, notwithstanding the upcoming testimonies to be heard on 7 and 8 May 2020, it is sufficiently briefed and will not accept any further evidence in this case.
