## **Introduction**

1. By Judgment No. UNDT/2020/123 dated 20 July 2020, the Tribunal decided that the application is receivable and granted it on the merits. In light thereof, regarding remedies, the Tribunal issued the following orders, which the parties duly complied with:

... By **4:00 p.m. on Monday, 10 August 2020**, the Applicant is to file an updated submission on remedies, appending all relevant documentation, which is to be five pages maximum, using Times New Roman, font 12 and 1.5 line spacing;

... By **4:00 p.m. on Monday, 17 August 2020**, the Respondent is to file an updated submission on remedies, appending all relevant documentation which is to be a maximum of five pages, using Times New Roman, font 12 and 1.5 line spacing;

... By **4:00 p.m. on Friday, 21 August 2020**, the Applicant is to file her observations, if any, to the Respondent's updated submission on remedies, which is to be two pages maximum, using Times New Roman, font 12 and 1.5 line spacing;

... Unless otherwise ordered, the Tribunal will thereafter proceed to determine the issue of remedies.

## **Consideration**

2. In the Respondent's updated submission on remedies, he contends, *inter alia*, that the Applicant has failed to provide adequate information and/or documentation regarding her income loss in 2017.

3. The Tribunal agrees therewith, and before making any final determination on the issue of remedies, the Tribunal will allow the Applicant to produce this information and/or documentation. In failure thereof, the Tribunal will need to draw an adverse inference regarding the Applicant's income loss, as also argued by the Respondent.

4. In light of the above,

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

5. By **4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, 2 September 2020**, the Applicant is to submit:
- a. Pay slips from the fulltime job, which she held prior to receiving to offer of employment with UNAMID and which she claims that she resigned from in the expectancy of being recruited to the relevant UNAMID position as security officer;
  - b. All relevant tax records for 2016 and 2017;
  - c. Any other information and/or documentation that indicate (i) what her net income actually was in 2017 and (ii) would have been had she not resigned from her previous fulltime job.
6. By **4:00 p.m. on Friday, 4 September 2020**, the Respondent is to provide his comments, if any, to the Applicant 2 September 2020 submission.
7. Unless otherwise ordered, the Tribunal will thereafter proceed to determine the issue of remedies.
