# Introduction

1. On 16 March 2022, the Applicant filed a motion to request to adduce evidence. With this motion, he appended the relevant documentation, namely (a) an email correspondence regarding the Applicant's official phone internet access and (b) an email from the Applicant to B-S (name redacted).

2. The Applicant explains that:

a. "[H]is response to the allegations of misconduct included an attachment that due to a clerical oversight was not included when the response was annexed to the Application";

b. "[T]his evidence is relevant to the adjudication of the present matter as it pertains to the credibility of his testimony and that of [JZ]";

c. "[T]his evidence is not prejudicial to the Respondent as he already had that correspondence as it had been annexed to the response to the allegations of misconduct. Therefore, the correspondence in question was part of the elements that the Respondent had at [his] disposal and was bound to consider in making the contested decision".

3. The Tribunal is satisfied, in light of the Applicant's arguments, that the requested evidence is relevant to the facts of the case.

5. The Applicant's motion is granted—the relevant documents are admitted as evidence and included in the trial bundle.
