## **Introduction**

1. On 11 September 2021, the Applicant, a staff member of the United Nations Department of Global Communications, filed an application with the Tribunal contesting the “lack of decision” from the Advisory Board on Compensation Claims (“ABCC”) on his claim for compensation under Appendix D to the Staff Rules (“Appendix D”). Alternatively, he contests the Administration’s review of his claim as per the memorandum of 9 June 2021.
2. On 5 January 2022, the Respondent filed his reply to the application.
3. On 1 July 2022, the present case was assigned to the undersigned Judge.
4. On 18 July 2022, the Tribunal held a case management discussion (“CMD”) with the participation of the Applicant, his counsel and counsel for the Respondent.
5. Having reviewed the parties’ submissions and identified the main issues in dispute at the CMD, the Tribunal considers it appropriate to grant the Applicant leave to provide comments on i) the reply including the facts as presented by the Respondent, and ii) the most recent ABCC advice of 14 February 2022. The Applicant is also granted leave to submit further evidence, if any, in support of his case.
6. To afford an equal opportunity to the Respondent, he is also granted leave to file observations on the Applicant’s submission.

### **IT IS ORDERED THAT**

7. By **Thursday, 28 July 2022**, the Applicant file his comments and further evidence, if any, pursuant to para. 5 above; and
