Thank you, Mr. Chair,

- 1. At the outset, my delegation expresses sincere appreciation to the 1540 Committee for convening this important briefing.
- 2. We thank the USG for the opening remarks and the Chair of the 1540 Committee for the update.
- 3. We recognize the Committee's essential role in addressing the threat to international peace and security posed by the proliferation of nuclear, chemical, and biological weapons by non-State actors.
- 4. As we reflect on resolution 1540 (2004), we acknowledge its enduring relevance as a cornerstone of the global nonproliferation framework.
- 5. This pivotal document guides national strategies and fosters robust international cooperation, encapsulating our shared values and collective resolve to create a safer world.
- 6. We commend the notable progress documented in the Committee's annual review, particularly the increased submissions of national reports and the establishment of voluntary national implementation action plans.
- 7. These achievements demonstrate the resolution's adaptability in an ever-evolving security landscape and our collective commitment to transparency and accountability.
- 8. Somalia fully recognizes that primary responsibility for nonproliferation rests with national governments.

- 9. Nevertheless, we assert that capacity-building must remain a collaborative priority for the international community.
- 10. We are acutely aware of the multifaceted challenges many nations face—limited resources, insufficient technical expertise, and institutional capacity shortfalls—that can hinder effective implementation.
- 11. We therefore urge the international community to continue providing comprehensive support as Member States devise nonproliferation strategies tailored to their unique circumstances.
- 12. We must collectively advance national capacities by leveraging the knowledge and resources of our international partners.
- 13. We welcome the enhanced cooperation between the 1540 Committee and international, regional, and sub-regional organizations.
- 14. These partnerships are crucial for facilitating the exchange of expertise and technical assistance.
- 15. We applaud the Committee's robust outreach efforts, including targeted training courses that significantly empower national capacities across diverse regions.
- 16. Lastly, we remain steadfast in our commitment to actively collaborate with regional and international partners to prevent proliferation and foster a safer, more secure world for all.
