Background

• Training courses for 1540 PoC were held in China (September 2015) for the Asia-Pacific Region, in the Russian Federation (June 2016) for the OSCE Participating States and in Chile (October 2016) for the Latin American and Caribbean region.

- In resolution 2325 (2016) the Security Council urged the Committee to continue to undertake initiatives to strengthen the capacity of Points of Contact to assist in the implementation of resolution 1540 (2004), upon request the request of States, including through the continuation on a regional basis of the Committee's Point of Contact training programme.
- China offered to host, in cooperation with the 1540 Committee, a second training course for countries in Asia-Pacific region from 7 to 11 August 2017.

Overview

The aim of the training course was to provide the participants from States with an in-depth knowledge of resolution 1540 (2004) obligations and their implementation, as well of those of the follow-on resolutions, in particular resolution 2325 (2016). The course also provided an opportunity to strengthen cooperation and interaction among the Points of Contact and with the Committee. Opening addresses were given by the Chair of the 1540 Committee and a senior official of China's Ministry of Foreign Affairs². The instruction was undertaken by the 1540 Group of Experts with the support representatives of international organisations and the U.S.
