Al respecto, la Misión Permanente de Costa Rica tiene el honor de presentar adjunto, en seguimiento de la nota ECR-724-2007 del 14 de diciembre del 2007, la matriz con información actualizada por parte de nuestras autoridades correspondientes.

Asimismo, el Gobierno de Costa Rica desea manifestar una vez más que como país sin ejército, no posee ningún tipo de armas de destrucción de masas, ya sean químicas, biológicas o nucleares. De la misma forma, el Gobierno de Costa Rica reitera su compromiso con le desarme general y completo, y la no proliferación.
