Delegations are reminded that in accordance with Rule 3 of the Provisional Rules of Procedure of the Conference, credentials should be issued for all representatives, alternate representatives and advisers. Credentials should be issued either by the Head of State or Government or by the Minister for Foreign Affairs, or in the case of the European Union, by the President of the European Council or the President of the European Commission. Credentials should be handed to the secretariat of the Credentials Committee (Room W12 on the ground floor of the ECA Conference Centre).

Bilateral meetings

For bilateral meetings among States at the Head of State or Government or ministerial level, eight rooms, each with a capacity to hold a maximum of ten participants, will be available on the ground floor of the United Nations Conference Centre, Addis Ababa. Every effort will be made to keep consecutive appointments of the same delegation in the same room.

The Executive Office will be open to United Nations-funded participants beginning *today*, 13 July 2015, to collect the following documentations:

- (a) Passports;
- (b) Air tickets and itineraries confirming outbound flights from Addis Ababa; and
- (c) Boarding passes confirming inbound flights to Addis Ababa.

Once these documents have been submitted and reviewed, participants may collect their entitlements from the tellers at the bank.
