Tax Inspectors Without Borders (TIWB) is a joint initiative of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) supporting developing countries to build tax audit capacity. The TIWB Initiative facilitates targeted, highly specialised tax audit assistance and is an innovative and practical way of supporting developing countries to mobilise more domestic resources for development.

Currently active in 19 developing countries around the world, TIWB assistance programmes have already resulted in an additional USD 278 million in tax revenues being mobilised.
