

II. IAF vision and mission statements

A. A Vision for 2030

Option 3: A world where forests are protected, sustainably used and restored and their services are recognized and valued by all.

[If possible, merge Option 2 and 3 so it reads “A world where forest are protected, sustainably used and restored, providing economic, social and environmental benefits for all”]

B. Mission Statement

Option 5: Enhance cooperation, coordination and political commitment at all levels in order to promote [and enhance protection of forests, restoration of degraded forests and deforested areas], the implementation of SFM and enhance the contribution of forests to sustainable development and the well-being of all/people everywhere/present and future generations.

III. Strategic approach (definition)

There are three different and complementary paragraphs as options laid out for this section. We propose that all three paragraphs remain as part of the document.

A. Options for strategic approach/ global goals/ objectives/ targets

We suggest to adopt Option 1 (6 global goals linked to the 5 IAF Objectives and encompassing the 4 GOFs)

B. Options for global targets/deliverables

We suggest to adopt Option 2 (Identify quantifiable time-bound global targets/deliverables for the GOFs, forest-related SDGs and other commitments), as opposed to the first option that does not have quantifiable targets. However the quantifiable targets will necessarily need to be linked with existing targets from other already agreed international commitments. In the cases where there is no reference of a pre-existing quantifiable target we suggest to maintain the target as it reads in Option 1.

IV. Implementation Framework

A. Actions to achieve global goals/ objectives/ targets/ strategic approach

National policies and measures

We suggest to add the following changes to item (k)

“Identify and implement measures to enhance cooperation and cross-sectoral policy and programme coordination among sectors affecting and affected by forest policies and management, with a view to integrating the forest sector into national decision-making processes and promoting sustainable forest management, including by addressing the underlying causes of deforestation and forest degradation and reversing the loss of forest cover, by implementing forest landscape restoration and by promoting forest conservation”

International cooperation and means of implementation

We suggest to add the following changes to item (d)

“Develop and establish positive incentives, in particular for developing countries as well as countries with economies in transition, to **reverse the loss of forest cover worldwide through sustainable forest management, including protection, restoration, afforestation and reforestation, and increase efforts to prevent forest degradation**”
