Voluntary National Report on progress towards the implementation of the UN Strategic Plan for Forests 2017–2030, the UN Forest Instrument and Voluntary National Contributions

Thank you for taking the time to complete the voluntary national report to the UN Forum on Forests (UNFF).

Before you start, please take note of the following important information:

- 1. The Economic and Social Council, in its resolution 2022/17, requested the UNFF secretariat to amend the format for voluntary national reporting to the Forum, taking into account the suggestions and proposals received from members of the Forum, and conduct a pilot phase for the use of the refined format. In the same resolution, the Council invited the Forum to consider establishing an advisory group on reporting. It further requested that the secretariat explore options for establishing an online reporting platform for the Forum, recognizing the need for streamlined reporting and minimizing the reporting burden, including the challenges faced by developing countries.
- 2. In fulfilling this mandate, the UNFF Secretariat has amended the format, taking into account the suggestions and proposals received from Members of the Forum and in consultation with the advisory group on reporting. The secretariat has also established an online reporting platform for the submission of voluntary national reports to the Forum.
- 3. The amended format is structured around the Global Forest Goals and targets of the UN Strategic Plan for Forests 2017–2030 (UNSPF) and builds on the previous format that was used for reporting to the UNFF15.

 - 8. Self-assessment of progress toward the Global Forest Goals and targets

NFI and its subsequent report represents a key component in national policy decision-making, ecological monitoring, and adaptive response to climate and conservation goals. Based on the report relevant recommendations have already been prepared for forest management bodies.

Moreover, forest management-level inventory are also being carried out and it involves verifying the areas of forests, contributing to the overall process.

- -Encouraging legal business activities through minimal regulations -Simplified permit procedures & Low taxes
- Nominal prices for commercial use & free access for non-commercial use

Main results achieved for the action:

As a result, businesses have been utilizing the NWFPs. In 2023 permits were given to 1305.5 t of NFWPs and in 2024 the number amounted to 1168.05 t.

Moreover, ecotourism is being actively developed in the forest in the framework of which development plans are being elaborated.

Since 2021, 25 permits were issued for recreational use of forests, 96 permits for for agricultural use and 1 permit for arranging animal shelters and breeding facilities.

In the Department of Environmental Supervision 38 out of 111 women are directly involved in reacting on environmental offences, including illegal logging in forests.

In Adjarian Forestry Agency 3 out of 32 women are foresters.

In the Agency of Protected Areas 4 out of 73 women are rangers
