Global leaders to convene at UN to galvanize bold action to achieve anti-poverty goals, set new course towards sustainable future

A number of major events during the high-level week of the UN General Assembly will focus on accelerating achievement of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and setting the roadmap for agreeing on a sustainable development framework beyond the 2015 MDG target date.

WHO: Heads of State and Government, joined by leaders from the private sector, civil

society organizations, philanthropists and senior UN officials

WHEN: 23-27 September 2013, with more events occurring before and after

WHERE: United Nations Headquarters, New York, and surrounding venues

WHAT: Key intergovernmental events taking place include the President of the General

Assembly's Special Event on the MDGs (25 September) and the High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (24 September). Dozens of other meetings and side events by governments, UN agencies and leaders from civil society, foundations and the private sector will inform these two events and are

expected to result in announcements of new actions.

The President of the General Assembly's Special Event on the MDGs 25 September, 9.00 a.m. – 6.00 p.m.

The President of the General Assembly will host a Special Event towards achieving the MDGs, at which UN Member States are also expected to set a roadmap for defining the post-2015 sustainable development agenda. Details at: www.un.org/millenniumgoals/specialevent.shtml

The Secretary-General will present his annual report on accelerating the MDGs – which this year includes his recommendations on the post-2015 development agenda – to UN Member States at the Special Event. Inaugural meeting of the High-level Political Forum on sustainable development 24 September, 3.00 – 7.00 p.m.

The High-level Political Forum (HLPF), established as an outcome of the Rio+20 conference, will bring Heads of State and Government together every four years to promote the implementation of sustainable development and address new challenges. The HLPF will also meet annually at the ministerial level on sustainable development issues. The closing session of the Commission on Sustainable Development, on 20 September, will lead up to the inaugural meeting of the HLPF, which will assume the functions of the CSD at a higher level.

MDG Success: Accelerating Action, Partnering for Impact 23 September, 10.00 a.m. – 6.00 p.m. Trusteeship Council, UN Headquarters

Hosted by United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, *MDG Success:*Accelerating Action, Partnering for Impact, brings together Heads of State and Government as well as leaders from the private sector, civil society, philanthropy and international organizations to catalyze further progress to achieve the MDGs. Focusing on concrete examples of scaling up success and identifying opportunities for further action with an emphasis on the "how", the event will highlight examples from partnerships across the spectrum of the MDGs and is intended to help enrich the deliberations of the General Assembly on 24-25 September and beyond. WHY:

The MDGs have been the most effective global anti-poverty push in history, and the success of the MDGs so far is a strong foundation for further progress to be achieved by 2015 and beyond. Several MDG targets have already been met and, with intensified action, more can be reached in the next two years – but accelerated progress is needed in many areas. As the MDG target date approaches, the UN, Governments, civil society and others have been engaged in an extensive process to address a range of growing international challenges and meet the needs of people and planet. September's high-level events come as the world's quest to end poverty and put the planet on a sustainable course has reached an unprecedented moment of urgency.
