Water Operators have a tremendous role to play in meeting MDGs


There are capacity gaps, but utilities are also source of great expertise



Work with practitioners to draw lessons from practice



The GWOPA Advisory & Financing Facility

- Ensuring WOPs capacity gains translate into better service for the poor
- Targeting small utilities with little credit worthiness but which have demonstrated initial successes through WOPs
- Using initial successes and higher internal revenues to leverage funds to implement further changes
- PIP implementation to bridge the gap toward larger sector loans for governance Operational efficiency Revenue generation






Training and Capacity Building
