Some experiences

- Organisational and culture changes have a failure rate of over 70%
- Partnerships are primarily relation based rather than output based
- Not penny but patience (time) is key resource for performance improvement
- There is no one single succes prescription for a poor functioning water operator
- Do not start talking but listen first (typical male problem?)


