Water for Development is the main theme of the World Water Week 2015 and this Report, the flagship publication of UN-Water, provides a focused descriptive analysis that demonstrates how water is a key factor in a future sustainable world. Taking into account economic growth, social equity and environmental sustainability, a forward-looking narrative describes how major challenges and change factors in the modern world will affect – and can be affected by – water resources, services and related benefits in a not too distant future. The audience will interact with the panelists on the vision of a sustainable world where water is managed in support of human well-being and ecosystems. The main objective of the session is to inform general public, policy- and decision-makers, about the role and importance of water in a future, sustainable, world. The session will address both thematic challenge areas and regional highlights. Josefina Maestu, Director of UNW-DPAC will participate as moderator of one of the sessions on Perspectives.

It will also discuss what kind of messages should be delivered to the forthcoming major international conferences including 2nd UN Special Thematic Session on Water and Disasters in New York, COP21 in Paris, Humanitarian Summit in Istanbul and Habitat III in Quito from the "water and disasters" community. Using leading examples of how the private sector has engaged with governments, civil society and academia in collective water stewardship, this session will critically discuss lessons learned in driving more sustainability through agricultural supply chains. These valuable lessons will be captured as we move toward implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals and will guide water stewardship in going beyond reducing business risk to making significant and meaningful contributions to more equitable development.
