UN-Water Decade Programme on Advocacy and Communication co-convened with the UN World Water Assessment Programme and the UN-Water Decade Programme on Capacity Development the 2013 UN-Water Seminar.

Participants presented and discussed the most recent proposals for a Water Sustainable Development Goal. There are different proposal as well as for targets and indicators covering both access to basic water and sanitation services, water resources management and pollution and wastewater management. A key question is if these will trigger action in the same way as the Millennium Development Goal target on water has done. Does this have the same level of clarity and will help provide the same focus for action? and/or what would be the necessary means and accompanying measures by the international community, the governments and the different stakeholders? These are some of the questions this Stakeholder dialogue with representatives of farmers, women, youth, international cooperation, business and the scientific community tried to respond.
